All students with disabilities are entitled to a free,

appropriate education in the least restrictive environment. But who decides what is "appropriate" for a particular child, and what constitutes the "least restrictive environment?" Whether the placement is yet undecided, the general education classroom with all necessary supports, services, accommodations and modifications, or a private school, parents often find themselves in the role of advocate.
